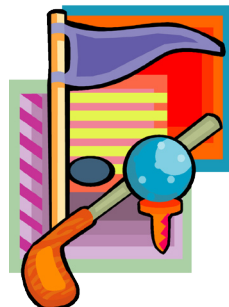

The Cleanup Event did give rise to another continuing maintenance issue that requires our collective consideration.

According to our crack Mary Hill Forensics Team, an astonishingly high percentage of the trash collected was classified as regular homeowner garbage. Everything from cereal boxes to milk bottles to un-opened junk mail. Some time ago we contacted Veolia that their personnel needed to be more careful when they load up their carts. They responded by saying their people are required not leave any loose trash behind, and that technically, all rubbish is supposed to be bagged and covered to avoid the wind from blowing trash around. It was suggested that the root cause may be that too many homeowners are placing un-bagged, loose trash at the curb.

Therefore, we respectfully ask that everyone please comply with the bagged rubbish requirement and also cover their 're-cycle' bins to prevent

further 'trashing' of our neighborhood.

One last reminder for anyone who could not make the April date. You still have until Wednesday May 13 to sign up for the **Makeup Date, Sat May 16**. Please give us the courtesy of advance notice so that we can properly plan for the correct amount of materials and manpower for the day's projects.

For a nominal additional fee, garbage can be picked up right outside your garage doors vs. curb. This alleviates much of the blowing issues. Contact Veolia directly for cost and / or to sign up for the service.

On the 16th, we will all meet at the main Entrance on hwy K at 9 AM. Please bring your own rake and shovel and wheel barrow to help with turf repair. If we have enough manpower and the

proper equipment, we may also have a firewood-splitting detail at the sled hill. We will plan to work until noon or as long as there is interest.

If it looks like rain, be sure to check email for re-scheduling.

Lastly, as the landscape continues to bloom up, please keep an eye out for any trees or shrubbery that looks like it did not survive the winter and notify us so we can replace before the spring planting season passes by.
